## **Adverb + Adjective Collocations**

**Teacher's Notes** 



Level: Intermediate

**Description:** Whilst knowing which words sound right together may seem *ridiculously easy* for native speakers blessed with the innate ability to collocate, this is *highly unlikely* to be the case for the average English learner! The written and communicative exercises in this activity sheet help to familiarise students with some of the more common Adverb + Adjective Collocations, offering them fun and varied practice, both alone and with a partner.

**Aim:** To practise Adverb + Adjective Collocations though a series of written and communicative exercises.

**Procedure:** Give each student a copy of the two-page activity sheet.

**Exercise A:** Students begin completing the Adverb + Adjective Collocations in each sentence by adding the correct adverb. They then talk with a partner to see if they can think of any other adjectives often used with these adverbs.

**Exercise B:** Next, students match the adverbs on the left with the correct adjectives on the right.

**Exercise C:** Students then complete the Adverb + Adjective Collocations in each sentence by adding a suitable adjective.

**Exercise D:** Following this, students use suitable Adverb + Adjective Collocations to complete the questions. Once they've done this, they work with their partner and ask each other the questions.
