## **Natural Disasters**

## **Teacher's Notes**



Level: Intermediate

**Description:** Though they may be something very few of us ever wish to face, Natural Disasters are a grim reality of our world which seem to pop up all too frequently in the news. And regardless of whether one's life has been directly affected by them or not, knowing the vocabulary associated with them is essential. This activity sheet helps to familiarise students with the most common Natural Disasters, offering them fun and varied practice through a series of written and communicative exercises.

**Aim:** To practise language associated with Natural Disasters through a variety of written and spoken exercises.

**Procedure:** Give each student a copy of the two-page activity sheet.

**Exercise A:** Students begin by completing the sentences using a suitable word, then underlining the Natural Disaster in each sentence.
