Vocabulary Associated with Phones

Teacher's Notes

Level: Intermediate

Description: Whether one loves them, hates them, or is utterly dependent on them as so many of our students are, phones are a prominent feature in both our personal and professional lives. And like so many other topics in English, they come with an array of of tricky but extremely useful vocabulary of their very own. The exercises in this activity sheet help to familiarise students with Vocabulary Associated with Phones, offering them fun and varied practice, both alone and with a partner.

Aim: To practise Vocabulary Associated with Phones through a series of written and communicative exercises.

Procedure: Give each student a copy of the two-page activity sheet.

Exercise A: Students begin by matching the beginnings of the sentences with the correct endings.
