## **Verbs Associated with Family**

**Teacher's Notes** 



Level: Intermediate

**Description:** Family life, like many popular classroom topics, brings with it a range of vocabulary of its very own, including a handful of rather confusing Phrasal Verbs. Though these may be tricky for some to master, when it comes to describing (and quite often complaining about) family life, they certainly come in handy. The exercises in this activity sheet help students to practise Verbs Associated with Family in a varied and practical way, both alone and with a partner.

**Aim:** To practise Verbs Associated with Family though a series of written and communicative exercises.

**Procedure:** Give each student a copy of the two-page activity sheet.

**Exercise A:** Students begin by underlining the correct Phrasal Verb in each sentence.
