## **Vocabulary Associated with Work**

**Teacher's Notes** 



Level: Intermediate

**Description:** Whether it's the be-all and end-all your existence, or something you do simply to pay the rent, work is a reality which most of us have to face. And like so many other common classroom conversation topics, it comes with its own array of tricky yet vital vocabulary. The exercises in this activity sheet help to familiarise students with Vocabulary Associated with Work, offering them fun and varied practice, both alone and in pairs.

**Aim:** To practise Vocabulary Associated with Work though a series of written and communicative exercises.

**Procedure:** Give each student a copy of the two-page activity sheet.

**Exercise A:** Students begin by matching the beginnings of the sentences with the correct endings.
